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Lughnassad (August 1)

Lughnassad, Lughnasadh or Lammas is celebrated by some covens on August 5, the date of Old Lammas, when the sun is at 15 degrees Leo. This Sabbat commemorates the funeral games festival of Lugh. Lugh is said to have held the first festival in honour of the death of his foster-mother, Tailte. It is a Sabbat celebrating life, strength and family. In Ireland, it is the traditional date for handfastings, as well as the Tailtean craft fairs.

Lughnassad is also a celebration of the first harvest of the year. This is when the spring plants and trees drop their fruits and seeds, and the first crop of grain is harvested. It signals the first signs of autumn, with the Sun God entering his mature years. He symbolically loses strength each day, as the nights get longer. The Mother Goddess is now glowing in her pregnancy, and life and abundance are everywhere.

Deities: Lugh, Apollo, Hercules, Demeter, Ceres, Gaia, Dana

Colors: yellow, orange, red, green

Foods: apples, grains, breads, berries, grapes, pears, barley soups, beer, mead, wine, apple cider

Herbs/Flowers: all grains (protection), grapes (fertility, garden magick, money), heather (protection, rain-making, luck), blackberry (healing, money, protection)

Trees: apple (faery folk, love, healing), pear (lust, love), oak (the God, protection, health, money, fertility, luck), elder (the Goddess, protection, healing, prosperity)

Incense: aloe (protection, luck, healing), rose (love, enhance psychic powers, healing, luck, protection), sandalwood (protection, wishes, healing, spirituality)

Crystals: carnelian (protection, peace, eloquence, healing, courage), bloodstone (healing, victory, courage, legal matters, wealth, strength, business, agriculture), yellow topaz (protection, healing, weight loss, money, love)

Activities include harvesting and feasting on the fresh crops. Saving the seeds of ritual fruits and planting them to honour the God and Goddess. Athletic games and Nature hikes, craft fairs and Handfastings.

Mabon (Approximately September 21)

Mabon is also known as the Second Harvest Festival, the Wine Harvest, the Feast of Avalon, Equinozio di Autunno, Mea'n Fe'mhair, Cornucopia, and the Autumnal Equinox. This Sabbat is held on the Fall Equinox, varying from year to year but usually occurring between September 20 and 23.

On this Sabbat, night and day are in perfect balance. The Moon Goddess' power is growing, however, with the Sun God weakening, as the days grow shorter and the nights grow longer.

Thanks are given to the waning sun for the harvest. Offerings of cider, wine, herbs, or fertilizer are given to the Green Man and the Nature Spirits. The Goddess is aging, entering her phase as the Crone, and she prepares for the death of her consort, the Sun God. This is an ideal time to finish any old business, relax, and reflect on the past year.

Deities: Thoth, Thor, Hermes, the Green Man, Morrigan, Epona, Rhiannon, Persephone, the Muses

Foods: wine, gourds, grains, corn, apples, pomegranates, dried seeds, breads, vegetables, fresh meats

Herbs/Flowers: pinecones (fertility), acorns (fertility), ivy (protection, healing), Benzoin (purification, prosperity), fern (rain-making, protection, luck, wealth, health), grains (protection), honeysuckle (money, enhance psychic powers, protection), marigold (protection, prophetic dreams, legal matters, enhances psychic powers), myrrh (protection, healing, spirituality), passion flower (peace, sleep, friendship), rose (love, enhances psychic powers, healing, luck, protection), sage (longevity, wisdom, protection, wishes), Solomon's seal (protection), tobacco (healing, purification), thistle (strength, protection, healing)

Incense: myrrh (protection, healing, spirituality), sage (longevity, wisdom, protection, wishes)

Colors: red, orange, russet, maroon, brown, gold

Crystals: sapphire (enhances psychic powers, love, meditation, peace, defensive magick, healing, money), lapis lazuli (healing, joy, love, fidelity, enhances psychic powers, protection, courage), yellow agate (strength, courage, protection), yellow topaz (protection, healing, weight loss, money, love)

Activities include enjoying the second harvest and feasting with family and friends. Or perhaps performing rituals of harmony and balance, and paying homage to the aging deities. It is a good time to practice spells for protection, prosperity, or confidence.

Iniskim Umaapi

In the remote Eastern region of Alberta, Canada, lies an ancient Temple Complex known as the Majorville Medicine Wheel (Iniskim Umaapi). It was created more than 5,000 years ago by the Oxbow First Nations, and has been in almost continuous use since then. It is likely the site was used for many different functions and rituals over its vast lifetime. Although it seems to have served predominantly as a site for religious ceremony, it also appears to be an astronomical observatory.

Dr. Gordon Freeman, Professor Emeritus at the University of Alberta, has been studying the site for many years and has come to some startling conclusions. Dr. Freeman believes this site is an ancient calendar which would make it one of the oldest accurate calendars ever recorded. This massive stone structure predates Stonehenge, the complex Mayan calendars, and the Dendera calendar in Egypt.

The site itself is 19 Sq. miles, with the main central cairn an astounding 30 feet in diameter. Surrounding the cairn is a stone circle nearly 90 feet across. 28 "spokes" connect the stone circle to the inner cairn. Smaller cairns are found in the hills in surrounding the site and appear to be aligned to various constellations. Other stone works appear to be representations of the Sun, Crescent Moon and Venus.

The main cairn has become known as the Sun Temple. Four of the spokes are aligned with the four directions. Other spokes appear to be observation lines for the Summer and Winter Solstices. The 28 spokes are indicative of a Lunar aspect. The calendar marks the monthly cycle of the Moon, as well as the 19-year Lunar cycle.

As with many indigenous societies, the Oxbow Plains Indians viewed the cosmos as a living womb, with Mother Earth nurturing them through their lives. The Divine Feminine was recognized as the source of human, animal and vegetable life.

The First Nations of the Great Plains tended to be matrilineal, with women serving as equal partners in the affairs of the tribe. Tipis, their contents, food supplies and even horses were owned by women, and it was the women who decided where the tipi would be pitched as the nomadic peoples made camp. When a daughter married, the husband moved in with the wife's family, until enough supplies could be gathered for the couple to move into their own tipi.

Although the men of the tribe were the primary hunters, once harvested, the slaughtered animals became the property of the women of the tribe. As well, the women gathered berries, herbs and cultivated gardens. They used these opportunities to teach the younger women the healing properties of various plants.

The Majorville Medicine Wheel is a wonderful example of the creative and intellectual abilities of our First Nations Peoples. We should feel honoured they have shared their land, and their heritage, with us.

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White Moon Cider

Ingredients:

- 4 cups apple cider
- 4 cups grape juice
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1 tsp allspice
- 1/2 tsp whole cloves

Cinnamon sticks

In a 4-quart saucepan, heat cider and grape juice over medium heat. Add cinnamon, allspice and cloves.

Bring to boiling, stirring frequently. As you stir, clockwise, visualize the attributes you'd like to bring into your life (wisdom, healing, protection, connection to Goddess...). Lower heat and simmer for 5 minutes.

Ladle into cups and add a cinnamon stick for stirring.

Makes 8 cups.
